****SCHOLARSHIP INFO**:**

Seniors are emailed all scholarship information and applications!

Need money to go to college? The Panther Pride Foundation for Central Schools has scholarships available for Central High School Seniors. The PPF scholarship application is only available for completion at www.pantherpride.org. Click on the SCHOLARSHIPS tab, then the Senior Scholarship Application on the pop-down menu. Your application must have: Transcript from Central High School, Letter of Recommendation, Personal Statement, and Resume. For certain scholarships, a short essay, or a personal letter may be required. All essays must be written entirely by the student. **The deadline for submitting the PPF scholarship application and additional information is Monday, March 16, 2026, by 3:00 pm to PPF website www.pantherpride.org. No late applications will be accepted.**

- The Illinois Sheriffs' Association will be awarding over \$58,000 in college scholarships throughout the State of Illinois to students wishing to pursue higher education during the 2026-2027 academic year. The scholarships are to be applied to tuition, books, and fees only. The student must be enrolled full-time at a certified institution of higher learning, full-time. Online learning is also acceptable. Sheriff Anthony Grootens, Adams County, will be awarding two scholarships in the amount of \$500 each. Applicants must be permanent Illinois residents and be enrolled as a full-time student during the 2026-2027 school year (excluding summer session). Students must complete the application, answer the essay question, and return all documentation to the Sheriff's office in their permanent county of residence by **March 13, 2026** (must be postmarked by this date). - The Lawton Endowment Fund Scholarship is offering a scholarship to high school seniors attending a private, accredited college or university in the US and abroad. To be eligible to apply, you must live in the following townships in Adams County: Lima, Keene, Houston and Northeast. **Applications must be mailed and received by March 31, 2026.**
- The J.L. Wade Foundation Scholarship is a one-year, up to \$5,000 scholarship administered by the J.L. Wade Foundation. Priority is given to students who will be pursuing degrees to promote the study of nature and the preservation of the environment and supporting studies related to nature (e.g. ag science, atmospheric science, coastal zone management, environmental engineering, environmental chemistry and toxicology, environmental health, environmental law, fisheries management and conservation, marine biology, etc.) The scholarship will assist those seeking to obtain the benefits of a college education. **Applications must be postmarked or received by the Wade Foundation on or before March 31, 2026.**
- The Tri-State Desk and Derrick Club invites all high school graduates who will be attending a **TECHNICAL OR TRADE SCHOOL** to apply to their scholarship.
Minimum Requirements:
 - Must be a U.S. Citizen
 - Must have a career goal in the natural gas or oil industry
 - No age restriction as long as applicant has a high school diploma, GED, or high school transcript showing completion through homeschooling
 - Must be an Indiana, Illinois or Kentucky resident OR a student attending, or planning to attend an accredited Indiana, Illinois or Kentucky technical or trade school

- Applications are due April 1st, 2026.

The Western Illinois Tractor Club is offering eligible senior students to earn one of three \$500 scholarships. Students must attend a technical school, junior college, or university in the fall of 2026 to be eligible. All applicants must use this scholarship toward an **Ag related degree**. Applications must be received by **April 4, 2026**.
